Dear Wyngate families,

The Wyngate PTA and the Wyngate Foundation are pleased to announce this year's "One Author, One School" program. On Dec. 4, award-winning, New York Times bestselling graphic novelist and author/illustrator Kazu Kibuishi will visit with our students during grade-specific assemblies at school. The PTA has sponsored his visit, and the Foundation has purchased a copy of one of Mr. Kibuishi's books for every Wyngate classroom, as well as a set of his books for our school's media center.

This special program will provide our children with the opportunity to interact with an accomplished writer and artist while enjoying a shared reading experience with our community. In a survey of Wyngate students and staff, Mr. Kibuishi was the first choice of our students; further, Mr. Wiebe was supportive of our selection of a graphic novelist for this year's program.

Mr. Kibuishi's books are clever, poignant and beautifully illustrated. Prior to Mr. Kibuishi's visit, we strongly encourage you to read at least one of his books with your children. Mr. Kibuishi is best known for *Amulet*, a graphic novel series that follows the adventures of two children through a fantastic, richly detailed parallel world. A thrilling tale inhabited by talking animals and giant robots, it's an engaging series imparting virtues such as courage and resilience. Mr. Kibuishi's other books include the *Explorer* and *Flight* book series as well as his popular web comic, *Copper*, which may be of particular interest to our kindergartners and first graders. Another note of interest: Mr. Kibuishi was selected to re-illustrate the covers of the Harry Potter books to celebrate the 15th anniversary of their publication.

Mr. Kibuishi will be signing books after school on Dec. 4 outside the media center.

We hope that students enjoy the art page and bookmark contests. The Wyngate classroom with the most number of art page submissions (one per student, please) will participate in a private graphic novel workshop with Mr. Kibuishi on the afternoon of his visit. Also, the winner of the bookmark contest will have his or her bookmark printed and distributed to every Wyngate student as a special keepsake of the event. All art pages and bookmark contest entries must be submitted to your child's teacher by **Friday, Nov. 2**.

Kazu Kibuishi is the founder and editor of the Flight Anthologies, a critically acclaimed comics series, as well as the creator of Daisy Cutter: The Last Train, a winner of the YALSA Best Books for Young Adults Award.

Born in Tokyo, Japan, Kazu moved to the U.S. with his mother and brother when he was a child. He graduated from Film Studies at the University of California Santa Barbara, and then moved to Los Angeles to pursue a career in the entertainment industry. 

Grades: 3rd +




Amulet #2: The Stonekeeper's Curse

- * Keep your design inside the solid black line. Make sure any words or important details are inside the gray dotted line. You can draw right up to the black line, but **anything outside the dotted line may not print!**
- * Use bright colors and make sure any words can be read easily. Remember, this template is the actual size of the printed bookmark.
- * Need ideas? Try drawing:
 - Your favorite part of one of Mr. Kibuishi's books.
 - A character or characters from the book.
 - A picture that shows how reading the book made you feel.
 - You and your classmates reading the book.
 - A picture that shows why you love to read.
